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

How to Pay for College

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Misconceptions About College

- Every family pays the full Cost of Attendance or "sticker price" for the school their child is attending
 - One will have to pay for college all by him-/herself/themselves!
 - One will have to pay someone to complete financial aid applications or find colleges or scholarships for your child
- A student probably won't qualify for financial aid, so you shouldn't complete financial aid applications anyway
- Only high-achieving students win scholarships

- Transportation
 Personal Expenses

Types of Financial Aid

\circ Grants

- Need-based gift aid
- From federal or state government, schools, or organizations
- First-come, first-served
- O Loans
 - Bo<mark>rrow and pay back with inter</mark>est
 - Major, future career should be considered with how much you plan to borrow
 - Can borrow from the college/university, government, or private institutions
 - Colleges, universities, and the federal government typically have lower interest rates
 - Federal loans are in student's name, Parent PLUS Loans look into parents' credit
 - Begin to repay when student leaves college or drops below half-time

- \circ Work-study
 - Part-time jobs for students with financial need
 - Typically on-campus
 - Hours depend on awarded amount
 - Nothing owed at the end of the year
- Scholarships
 - Merit-based or need-based gift aid
 - Students of all ages can win scholarships!

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Financial Aid Applications

- FAFSA Free Application for Federal Student Aid
 - Student must be a U.S. citizen, legal permanent resident, or U.S. national
 - Opens Oct. 1 each year
 - Uses prior-prior year's taxes (ex: 2018-2019 Application is using 2016 tax return)
 - Each school has their own deadline
 - EFC Expected Family Contribution
 - FAFSA4caster Bottom of the page on FAFSA.gov

- TASFA Texas Application for State Financial Aid
 - Must be a Texas resident for three years prior to graduation from a Texas high school or GED completion
 - May qualify for in-state tuition and state financial aid
- CSS Profile
 - Required from some private universities in addition to FAFSA
 - Gives access to need-based scholarships

Scholarships

- Based on major
- Based on race/ethnicity
- Based on hobbies and interests
- Based on GPA or test scores
- For students enrolled at particular schools
- Offered by local organizations or donors

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College Greenlight

- <u>CollegeGreenlight.com</u>
- Matches you to scholarships based on your profile
- Helps you sort scholarships by:
 - Name
 - Number of people that apply
 - Amount of effort it will take
 - Award amount
 - Deadline IONIO EDUCATIO
- Has a blog to help you find specific resources
